



deadly

***Remember . . .**

**-y at the ends of short words usually says /I/,
&**

-y at the ends of longer words usually says /ee/.

If that rule doesn't make a word you know,
just *flip it* to the other sound!

To change the word **deadly** to show that something is *more deadly* than another, we cannot simply add the ending.

~~deadlyer~~

~~deadlyest~~

(We'd try to read the y as a consonant, not a vowel.)

So what do we do?

***When adding endings,
we change the **y** to an **i**
and then add the endings.***

The i will make the sound the y made
in the original word.

~~deadly~~
deadlier
deadliest

It works the same with other
endings, too.

~~cry~~
cries
cried

~~beauty~~ → beautiful

~~happy~~ → happiness

~~angry~~ → angrily
