

When a y acts like a vowel, it usually sounds like an **1** or an **C** making its long sound (saying its name), and it's usually at the ends of words. Short word? It usually says /eye/. Long word? It usually says /ee/.

Y can also make a <u>short i sound</u> when it's acting like a vowel <u>within</u> words.
