

When a **y** acts like a vowel, it usually sounds like an **i** or an **e** making its long sound (*saying its name*), and it's usually at the ends of words. Short word? It usually says /eye/. Long word? It usually says /ee/.

Y can also make a short i sound when it's acting like a vowel within words.
