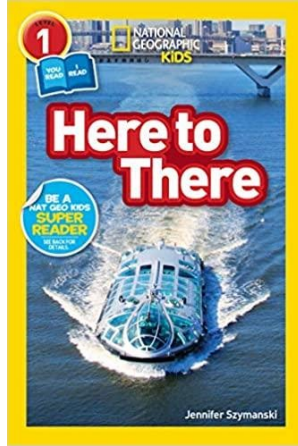


# Here to There
