

These words, below, sound like they would have two o's saying /oo/ (like in Cookie Crisps). They are tricksters, and we have to remember that o-u-l says /oo/ in these three base words.

Note that the word **WOOd** (made from trees) is spelled with two o's. The homophone\*, **WOUld**, has an o-u-l that says /oo/.

\*homo = same & phone = sound  $\rightarrow$  homophone = same sound
