



These words, below, sound like they would have two o's saying /oo/ (like in Cookie Crisps). They are tricksters, and we have to remember that o-u-l says /oo/ in these three base words.

Write the following words:

Note that the word **wood** (made from trees) is spelled with two o's. The homophone*, **would**, has an o-u-l that says /oo/.

*homo = same & phone = sound → homophone = same sound
