

The sound /k/ can be spelled a few different ways. k = /k/(kickin', k)

k = /k/(kickin'k)
kid, karate, rake, speak, smoke, took
c = /k/ (hard) or /s/ (soft)
castle, cake, cotton, cone, cup, cube, cord
center, Cinderella, cycle, peace, pencil, icy
ch = /ch/(can say /k/ and /sh/)
chips, *much, chat, smooch (<u>Ch</u> ristmas and Mi <u>ch</u> igan) *-tch usually says /ch/ after short vowels
ck = /k/ (follows short vowels, only)
back, neck, pick, sock, luck, rocket, snacking
