Welcome/Introductions

ABCs (Sing the a-b-c song to place the letter magnets in a-b-c order, and then sing again, pointing to the letters as you do so.)

Vowel Song (sing song, pointing to letters on poster)

Read Featured book(s)

Letter Sounds Instruction-

Share pictures/items beginning with v, e, and t.

Teacher: names initial sound, names pictures, and names initial sound again.

Match pictures of other items with same sounds/letter cut outs:

/v/, vet, /v/ (kids repeat)

beginning-vacuum, vegetables, volcano, violets, violin, van

/e/, elephant /e/ (kids repeat)

beginning- elephant, eggs, envelope, elbow, elf, exit sign, *Long e sound- eagle, ears

/t/, teeth, /t/ (kids repeat)

beginning-table, (ten tiny) toes, tigers, turkey, taco, teeth

Handwriting-

v (small), e (small), t (tall)

Need:

pencils

tracing papers (add stars to show where to place pencil at the start)

handwriting papers (earn LifeSavers, below)

NOTE: Add a star for starting spot on each letter.

Sweet Treat/Multisensory Activity

Need:

LifeSavers (Vets can be real life savers.)

Multi-sensory activity

Match the vets to the animals they care for.

Need:

Labels for kinds of vets (teacher adds information as needed)

Images with vets and animals

Animals pocket flash cards (to add to large animal vet, aquatic vet, small animal (pets) vets, wildlife vet.

We are keeping all the cards in the materials in case a student is interested in additional investigation. © *The pet vet animals *are* often pets, but these animal cards do not include the most common pets such as cats and dogs.
