Welcome/Introductions

ABCs (sing song, pointing to letters on poster) Vowel Song (sing song, pointing to letters on poster)

Read Featured book(s)

Q & U Call it Quits, by Stef Wade

Letter Sounds Instruction-

Share pictures/items beginning and ending with qu, i, t Teacher: names initial sound, names pictures, and names initial sound again.

Match pictures of other items with same sounds with the letter cut outs:

/kw/, quit, /kw/ (kids repeat)

beginning- quiet, queen, quack, question, quail, quartz, quarter (Note: Words don't end with qu.)

/i/, icky, /i/ (kids repeat)

beginning- igloo, iguana, ill, insects, inch worm, icky worm, invitation ice cream, ice, island, ice skate, ivy (Note: Words rarely end with /i/.)

/t/, teeth, /t/ (kids repeat)

beginning- teeth, tent, turtle, tail, two turkeys, trumpet, table (Note: T is found at the beginning, in the middle, and at the ends of LOTS of words.)

Multi-sensory activity

Play: Minute to Win It <u>Need:</u> Challenges list Timer (phone or 1 minute timer)

Ask: How many times can you do the following activities in one minute? When one minute is up, the timekeeper says, "Quit!"

Challenge List:

How many times can you **sing the alphabet song** in one minute? How many times can you **neatly write your name** in one minute? How many times can you **flip or shake (in your hands) a quarter and get "heads"** in one minute?

How many times can you sing *Happy Birthday to You* in one minute?

<u>Handwriting-</u> q (long), u (small), i (small), t (tall)

<u>Need:</u>

pencils

tracing papers (add stars to show where to place pencil at the start) handwriting papers (to earn toy plane)

Craft Planning Activity

Make a plan for creating a paper quilt. To plan, play with colored squares until you come up with a pattern you like, or make a "crazy quilt" that has no pattern at all.

<u>Need:</u> Colored squares Construction paper base

Craft activity

Make a paper quilt. <u>Need:</u> Paper squares Glue Square paper (onto which students will glue small squares) Sample quilt patters label (Kids write *quilt* to label their quilt.)

Matching Activity

Match upper- and lowercase letters and make the sound for each as you do the matching. Need: Laminated, printed pages Dry erase markers Erasers

Tip: Do one page, erase it, then do the next page.
